It marked the return of the Kashia to our coast after being forced from it more than 100 years ago.

The day will feature dance groups from Kashia and other area tribes, guided tours, and traditional foods. This achievement is the first of it's kind along our coast, so please join the celebration to mark the dedication of the Kashia Coastal Reserve.
